In recent months several issues which need to be discussed, have bubbled to the surface. Unfortunately having no executive, the only forum which represents all members of the Club, or at least reaches them, is this newsletter.

The first item is the \$20 Annual Dues. Now that we are meeting at the Hare & Firkin it has been proposed that we move it to Tuesday. Later in the week the crowds and noise of the Pub would not be conducive to meetings.

We will be discussing both issues, such as the Club discusses anything, at the Winter Party set for February 7th at the Highland Yacht Club.

The third item is the recent Fall Run which saw the Club host two separate Runs, East and West, on the same day. This was not the result of an acrimonious dispute, but of a convoluted process, a few misunderstandings and the wish to drive a long Run by a majority, and a wish to drive a shorter run by a sizable minority.

The result? Thirteen cars drove the East route starting in Bowmanville and running to a wonderful dinner at the Inn at Gores landing, Rice Lake, while seven more Lotus met in Milton and drove to Mono Cliff Inn. Both groups had great runs on a perfect day. There was only one complaint heard from diehards on the East Run.

"If they'd held the other Run on a different weekend I could have gone to both," said Andy, Caterham Seven.

Perhaps next year. The Club could easily manage two Runs in the Fall, especially if one was long and adventurous, and the other shorter and more convenient.






